Find My Number

Topic: Number Relationships

Object: Identify related numbers.

Groups: Whole class or small group

Materials

- transparency of Find My Number spinner, p. 109
- paper clip and pencil for spinner
- 50 Chart for each child, p. 138
- · 2 transparent counters for each child

Directions

- 1. The leader displays a Starting Number between 10 and 40.
- **2.** Children individually locate and cover the matching numeral on their 50 Chart with a counter.
- **3.** Using a paper clip and pencil, the leader spins the four-sectioned spinner to let children know how to relate the next number to the starting number. The children use another counter to identify the second number.

Example: If the starting number is 36 and "10 less" is spun, children indicate 26 with their second counter.

- **4.** The leader asks, "What is your second number? How are your two covered numbers related?"
- **5.** Children remove the second counter. Keeping the same starting number, the leader spins to identify a new number relationship. If the spinner indicates an amount not found on a 50 Chart, the leader spins again.
- **6.** After using a starting number for several rounds, the leader displays a new starting number, spins, and has children identify the resulting numbers and relationships.
- **7.** When children seem confident, the leader repeats the entire procedure with the more challenging six-sectioned spinner.

Making Connections

Promote reflection and make mathematical connections by asking:

- If you move up one row on a 50 Chart, how does the number change?
- What patterns did you notice as you identified the related numbers?

Tip As children gain confidence with this warm-up, expand it to include numbers beyond 50 by adding rows of tens, one row at a time.
